The role of the Church in our political process has been an ever evolving process that began with the church being the direct rule and guide, but now more recently the voice of faith has been coopted by gimmicks, false promises and moral impotence.

During this critical time in our State and Nation, The Woman's Baptist Home and Foreign Missionary Convention, under the guidance and leadership of the General Baptist State Convention is preparing for a massive outreach effort for voting in our Congregations. For the past 2 months many Churches across the state are standing up and training many of our leaders and ushers on ways churches can engage and what to look out for in regards to political engagement.

For years, many in the Faith Community have felt left out of the voting process. As many Churches provide more and more services through ministries in the Church, it has become critical to protect their 501c3 tax exemption status and thus leaves Church leaders to opt for a more passive approach to voter outreach. The reality is that regardless of tax status, the church and its members have a right to help educate ourselves on all matters of life including political. The Convention is also keenly aware of the importance of not letting Churches become subject to harmful repercussions of improper voter engagement. In June the General Baptist worked with non-profit groups to coordinate a, "Ushering in the Future" event where Ushers met to discuss how they can get involved in educating the congregation. Also many Congregations are designating Faith Ambassadors for Voting as a part of the Souls to the Polls campaign. This program is an annual effort to organize rides and marches to the polls during the early voting period. Each church that signs on receives training, materials and a Faithful Voter Pledge card to ensure their members know where to vote, what's on the ballot and the major changes to the election process. Jonathan is the son of Pastor and Mrs. Johnnie Bethea of Henderson Grove Missionary Baptist Church. Jonathan began his acting career in the Drama Ministry at Henderson Grove and was an award winning student in the Drama Department at Hillside High School. He graduated with a Bachelor of Fine Arts degree in 2010 from the University of North Carolina at Greensboro. He lives in Astoria Queens, New York.

Driving Miss Daisy is a 1987 play by Alfred Uhry about the relationship of an elderly white Southern Jewish woman, Daisy Werthan, and her African-American chauffeur, Hoke Colburn, from 1948 to 1973. The play was the first in Uhry's Atlanta Trilogy, which deals with white Jewish residents of
